Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to our second term, we hope you enjoyed the break. This term we have a new big question to focus on, 'I wonder what makes a superhero?'. Through this, we will be learning about heroes in stories, such as the woodcutter in Little Red Riding Hood and Supertato, everyday heroes such as the emergency services and famous superheroes, including Frida Kahlo, Rosa Parks and Mo Farah. As part of our learning, the children will also be imagining what kind of superhero they would be and designing their own superhero cape to paint. Please could each child bring in a plain pillowcase to use for their cape by Monday 9<sup>th</sup> December.

Children can wear a Superhero costume, of their choice, to school.

#### **Reading and Writing**

This week we will finish learning our level 2 sounds, we will continue to focus on these and use them to read and write simple words for the rest of the term. It is really important to continue to support your child's phonic journey at home by reading each night as well as practicing their sounds and using them to read and write simple words. Please remember to make a note in their reading record each time you hear your child read, we cannot emphasise enough the impact that regular reading at home has on a child's progress.

#### **Maths**

We will continue our focus on numbers this half term, looking at numbers 7,8,9,10. Please support your child by noticing numbers in the environment, asking them to count things out for you, practicing recognising and forming each numeral, recognising numbers of objects without counting them (subitising) or comparing the same number of large and small objects.

#### Christmas

Of course, with Christmas quickly coming upon us, we have planned lots of fun Christmas activities, including learning about the first Christmas. Maple will be acting out the Nativity story as part of our Christmas church service which will be a very special event. We will provide all of the costumes for the children which will be worn over their uniform. In addition to this, the children will be joining Willow class for their Nativity, as sheep (boys) and angels (girls). Please can you provide the boys with a black, white or

brown tops/trousers and the girls with white top and tights/leggings. We would like these into school by Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> December.

This term PE days will be Tuesday and Thursday only. Please ensure children wear their PE kit.










## Expressive Arts and Design
