Dear Parents and Carers,

As some of you might be aware over the Summer holiday we embarked on a very big project to replace the whole heating system in the school with a more environmentally friendly heart source pump system that runs on electricity and not oil.

Working in a school with parts originally built in the 1700s was never going to be easy and not without complications, however, we have in the last few days, when the temperatures have dropped, noticed a massive difference in how warm the school is in comparison to previous years. This project was fully funded by Salix. They deliver Government funded schemes to support lots of different organisations to boost energy efficiency. Salix have donated the costs involved to the Diocese, who in turn have led and paid for our heating project. This is one step towards our school becoming net zero and cut the carbon emissions from our school and create a more sustainable future.

On Friday 8<sup>th</sup> November we were joined by the CEO of Salix and various other members of the team as well as representatives from the Diocese, to tour the school and discuss with staff and children their thoughts on the project. John, Jasmine and Xavier met with the communications team to answer lots of questions and to share their hopes and dreams for the future.
