Our mindfulness sessions continue with Emily Bird for Willow Class and will extend to Year 6 over the next few weeks, and I know lots of children have found these beneficial.

What's coming up?

After the delightful interruptions of all the Christmas activities, school will be back to being focused on teaching and learning. We have however, many events planned throughout this half term.

This week, following a recommendation from the School Council for more art opportunities, each class will be studying a piece of art and producing some work in response to it.

We welcome Luke from Sportily, who will be running a 6 week Play leaders course with children from Oak Class.

We also welcome back Charlie, one of the coaches from Gloucestershire Cricket Foundation who is running cricket sessions for all the classes today.

The following week, **13**th January, starts with Young Voices, where we are taking a record number of children to sing in Birmingham. Our Look Whose Talking Competition also takes place, where we would like all children to take courage and talk about something that interests them. Children will be selected to go through to the local schools final.
